'Aid the Allies' Group Plans D. C. Crusade

**William Allen White,
Sponsor of Movement,
Asked to Speak Here**

Leaders of the newly formed Washington branch of the National Committee to Defend America by Aiding the Allies laid tentative plans yesterday for a city-wide mass meeting to give momentum to the movement.

William Allen White, Emporia, Kans., editor, has been asked to deliver the principal address, and other nationally known men will be invited to speak.

White is father of the movement, which aims to make as many planes available to the Allies as President Roosevelt feels the United States can safely spare, secure a Congressional appropriation of \$100,000,000 to aid war refugees in the war zone and stop the export of all war materials which may find their way to the Allies' enemies.

The mass meeting plans were discussed at a session in the home of Huston Thompson, 2500 Massachusetts avenue northwest, chairman of the local committee.

Robert Woods Bliss, former United States Ambassador to Argentina, told committee leaders that Hitler has declared that the United States as well as England and France "must be smashed as world powers and Germany will rule the world." The present state of Europe, he declared, is evidence enough of the danger of taking his threats lightly.

He said this country should spare no effort short of actual declaration of war "to aid those who are now fighting our battles across the sea."

Yesterday's conferees designated various groups to work among professional, ministerial, educational, social and industrial organizations to gain support of the committee's aims.

Mrs. Morrow to Speak

Emporia, Kans., June 2 (AP).—William Allen White, chairman of the Committee for American Defense Through Aid to the Allies, said today that Mrs. Dwight Morrow, Englewood, N. J., will make a radio address under the committee's auspices Tuesday night.

Mrs. Morrow, mother of Mrs. Charles A. Lindbergh, will speak on the subject, "Does America Deserve a Miracle?"

The address will be broadcast by the National Broadcasting Co., White said, from 11:15 to 11:30 p. m., Washington time.
