## 'America First' Going to Polls will Fight Roosevelt

## Foreign Policy in '42

CHICAGO, Dec. 1 (U.P.),-The National Committee of the America First Committee announced to-night that it would "go into the 1942 national elections" with support for candidates opposing the Administration's foreign policy.

The announcement was made by Gen. Robert E. Wood, acting national chairman.

The committee's statement con-The committee's statement con-demned the Administration's pol-icy as a "trend toward fascism in America" and demanded a "return to Congress" of only those mem-bers who "faithfully execute the people's trust."

"Accordingly," the statement said, "the America First Committee, which has not yet sought to influence the election of any candidate for public office, now be-lieves that in due time and in proper compliance with the law

this policy must be changed.
"Efforts must be directed toward the renomination and re-elec-Representatives in Congress who have kept faith with the people's mandate to avoid participation in the war."
