

America First' Probe Action Is Deferred

The Senate Campaign Expenditures Committee deferred action today on a request that it investigate introduction of the America First party convention in Detroit this week of a resolution calling for either the deportation or sterilization of Jews.

Chairman Green told reporters "we took no action on it; it was just brought up during the meeting and passed by."

He said the request, made by James H. Sheldon, Boston, administrative chairman of the Anti-Nazi League, "did not state that the resolution was passed, but that it was simply proposed."

James H. Sheldon, Boston, administrative chairman of the league, said in a telegram to Senator Green that "there is here a plain conspiracy to incite and encourage racial strife in America in time of war, and to deprive American citizens of their civil rights under the guise of carrying on activities as a 'political party'."

The resolution, presented to the Detroit convention Wednesday, was not brought to a vote of the delegates.

Gerald L. K. Smith, "America First Party" presidential nominee, said in Detroit last night that the convention did not "even consider" the resolution.
