Closing Session Here

Mrs. Warren C. Kendall, 2301 Connecticut avenue, was elected national treasurer of the Dames of the Loyal Legion at the closing session of the organization's 43rd annual meeting yesterday at the Mayflower Hotel.

Mrs. Harrison Smith of Philadelphia was named national president to succeed Mrs. David D. Good, Oceola Mills, Penn. Mrs. Good was elected senior vice president.

Other new officers are Mrs. Louis A. Coolidge, Boston, junior vice president; Miss Minnie Wade, New York, chaplain; Mrs. Ramsey Peugnet, Bronxville, N. Y., recorder; Mrs. E. H. Erickson, Chicago, registrar; Miss E. G. Hopkinson, Philadelphia, chancellor, and Miss Frances E. Curtiss, Detroit, historian.

The closing session was devoted mainly to the reading of reports from State chapter presidents and the adoption of resolutions. The group approved resolutions adopted last January by the Women's Patriotic Conference on National Defense.
