

## James Trial for Libel Delayed Indefinitely

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., May 20.—The trial of Edward Holton James, 69 Concord lawyer facing an indictment charging criminal libel of President Roosevelt, was postponed indefinitely today—without explanation—at the request of Assistant Attorney General Frank G. Volp of Massachusetts.

James, who had been held in jail under \$10,000 bail, was released in bail of \$500. Statements he had made in a pamphlet, titled Yankee Freeman, were the basis of the indictment.

The elderly attorney said he was prepared to prove that the President was beyond the jurisdiction of the Middlesex County Court and that the charges therefore were beyond the court jurisdiction.
