The demand of the atheists to arrest Father Coughlin is nothing but a demand to begin the persecution of the Catholic Church and its leaders."

Before Pearl Harbor, Darbinikas was loud in its suport of the Axis. When Germany invaded Russia, its headline was: "Lithuania Freed."
