

## 'Red Network' Author Called By Jury in Propaganda Quiz

Mrs. Elizabeth Dilling of Chicago, author of "The Red Network," who opposed the draft and the lease-lend bill, has been subpoenaed to appear before the District grand jury here tomorrow in conjunction with the activities of George Sylvester Viereck of New York City, reputed German super-propagandist.

Department of Justice authorities are interested in Mr. Viereck's activities and any possible violation of the Foreign Agents Registration Act.

Mrs. Dilling organized the Mothers of America to oppose the Selective Service Act and is head of the Patriotic Research Bureau.

In addition to Mrs. Dilling, a number of other witnesses, including Sigfried Hauck, president of Flanders Hall, Inc., publishing house of

Scotch Plains, N. J., have been summoned to appear here.

The grand jury began its inquiry last Friday, when a number of Federal Bureau of Investigation agents, allegedly inquiring into the activities of Mr. Viereck and the publishing house, went before it.

Special assistants to the Attorney General William Power Maloney and Edward J. Hickey, jr., who represented the Government in the Transocean German News Agency case, are assisting in the investigation.

Transocean was found guilty by a District Court jury recently of violating the Foreign Agents Registration Act, as was Friedrich Ernst Auhagen. Mr. Viereck's name was mentioned by Government prosecutors at the time of these trials.
