Sues Attorney Husband

**Mrs. Dilling
Asks Divorce**

**Mother's Crusade
Leader Was Fined Here**

CHICAGO, Feb. 24 (C.T.P.S.).
Suit for divorce was filed today
in Woodstock, Ill., in behalf of
Elizabeth Dilling, of Kenilworth,
author of "The Red Network,"
against Albert W. Dilling, a Chi-
cago attorney. The suit charged
cruelty and misconduct.

According to the suit, the Dill-
ings were married in Laporte, Ind.,
in 1918 and separated finally last
January 13 after previous separa-
tions and reconciliations. The
suit charges Dilling with indiscre-
tions with a Mrs. X. in 1922 and
with a Mrs. C. in 1941.

It asks that Mrs. Dilling be
given custody of a daughter, Eliza-
beth, 16, and the money for sup-
port, and also asks that Dilling
be enjoined from doing bodily
harm to Mrs. Dilling.

In the suit Mrs. Dilling describes
herself as author of books and
pamphlets of "political and na-
tional importance" and adds that
she has no means of support. Mrs.
Dilling came into national promi-
nence last March when she visited
Washington as head of the
mothers' crusade to defeat H. R.
1776, the lend-lease bill, and was
fined for disorderly conduct.
