

**Dilling Asks Wife <sup>part</sup>  
About Nazi Funds** 4/21/42

Chicago, April 21 (AP).—Albert W. Dilling, embroiled in a divorce suit with his wife, Elizabeth, author of "The Red Network," today asked the Superior Court to compel Mrs. Dilling to produce an accounting of any contributions she may have received since 1935 "from any American or foreign persons acting for any Axis government in spreading pro-Axis propaganda in the United States."

His petition also asked the opportunity to examine correspondence which Dilling alleged his wife received from 33 persons, including Charles A. Lindberg, William D. Pelley, the Silver Shirts leader; George Sylvester Viereck, convicted as a Nazi agent; Sir Oswald Mosley, the British Fascist; Father Charles F. Coughlin and Laura Ingalls, the former flier recently imprisoned for failure to register as a Nazi agent.
