

Dilling Airs Nazi Leanings of Wife

CHICAGO, Apr. 22.—Albert W. Dilling moved in court yesterday to air the alleged Nazi connections of his wife, Mrs. Elizabeth Dilling, isolationist author of *The Red Network*.

In the couple's heated divorce battle, Maurice Weinschenk, Dilling's attorney, petitioned the court to require Mrs. Dilling to produce her correspondence with 33 people, including convicted Nazi agents. On Weinschenk's list are:

George Sylvester Viereck, jailed for Nazi activities.

Laura Ingalls, No. 2 Nazi agent, also in jail.

Fritz Kuhn, German-American Bund leader, also in jail.

William Dudley Pelley, leader of the Fascist Silver Shirts.

Sir Oswald Mosley, British Fascist.

Charles E. Coughlin.

Charles A. Lindbergh.

Rep. Clare Hoffman, Michigan isolationist.

Joe McWilliams, Nazi street-corner rowdy.

Gen. George Van Horn Moseley, the "Man on the White Horse" who was to lead U. S. Fascists.

Lawrence Dennis, Fascist intellectual.

Gerald Winrod, Kansas Fascist.

The court will hear arguments on the petition today.
