

Mrs. Dilling Fined \$50 for Contempt

CHICAGO, Apr. 30.—Mrs. Elizabeth Dilling was held in contempt a fourth time today and was fined \$50 on the spot. Judge Desort said he would jail her if she was held in contempt again.

Desort called the attorneys and Mrs. Dilling together to examine numerous petitions introduced in her divorce battle since last week's session. On cross-examination Mrs. Dilling persisted in arguing, and finally snapped: "Weinshenk ought to be with Hitler."

(Maurice Weinshenk, counsel for Albert Dilling, was fired by Dilling in open court last week.)

Earlier, court seizure of all records and correspondence of Mrs. Dilling's Patriotic Research Bureau was asked in a motion filed in behalf of Weinshenk.

The petition said Mrs. Dilling "was recommended by Viola Bodenschatz to Adolf Hitler as a person whose service would be valuable as an agent of the German Government." On the stand Mrs. Dilling said she had met Viola Bodenschatz once "at a tea" and that she had received an order of \$1.25 from her for books "which Mr. Dilling handled."
