Mrs. Dilling to Press

Her Libel Action

CHICAGO, May 2 (C.T.P.S.). Settlement of the turbulent Dilling divorce case, which was disclosed Friday, will in no way deter Mrs. Elizabeth Dilling, author-crusader from proceeding with her million-dollar libel suit against Walter Winchell, New York gossip columnist, her attorney, Theodore W. Miller, announced today

Named with Winchell as codefendants in the libel action are Mrs. Dilling's husband, Albert W., lawyer-engineer, and his attorney, Maurice T. Weinshenk. This phase of the case came after Winchell broadcast charges of drug and liquor addiction originally made against Mrs. Dilling in Dilling's divorce suit but later deleted.

Under the terms of the agreement Mrs. Dilling will be allowed to get an uncontested divorce, and there will be a property settlement. Still pending, however, in addition to the libel action, are three contempt citations against Mrs. Dilling and a \$50 fine also levied for contempt of court. The next hearing before Judge Rudolph Desort will be Wednesday.
