

### **Hearing Continued In Mrs. Dillings' Case**

Chicago, Aug. 6 (AP).—Mrs. Elizabeth Dilling, red-haired campaigner against communism, and two defendants today were granted a continuance of their hearing on removal to Washington for trial on charges of conspiracy to break down the morale of the armed forces.

Edwin K. Walker, United States Commissioner, continue the hearing to September 9 when William Connor, assistant district attorney, said there was no need for an early hearing because the trials would not start until autumn.

The other defendants are George Otto Brennermann, an artist, and Dr. Donald Judson McDaniel, a dentist. Mrs. Dilling was charged with having circulated cartoons drawn by Brennermann and financed by Dr. McDaniel. The Government alleged the cartoons tended to injure the morale of the Nation's fighting men.
