## Hitler Aggressions Are Condemned at New Haven Rally

"The moment the spread of fascism throughout the world is stopped, at that very moment a new freedom will dawn over Germany." Dr. Ernest Meyer, for 15 years a member of the German diplomatic service, told a mass meeting of 1,500 persons in the New Haven High School Monday night sponsored by the New Haven Anti-Nazi League. Dr. Meyer recently resigned from throughout the world is stopped, at

Dr. Meyer recently resigned from the post of first secretary of the German Embassy in Washington which he held for the past seven years, in protest against the war policy of the Miller Government.

"The future of Germany and the whole of Western civilization are dependent upon each other, as no Western civilization can be regarded as secure without re-

regarded as secure without re-establishment of political, cultural and religious freedom in the center of Europe," he said.

He disclosed that more than 1,300

clergymen have been jailed by the Nazis for attempting to maintain the freedom of their religious

groups.

Yale University, who heads the
Anti-Nazi League, made a blister, ing attack against the Nazi German-American Bund as a threat "to the first principles of American democ-

first principles or racy."

"It is not German culture we oppose, but the barbarous denial of it, not the German people nor Americans of German birth and sympathies, but the victimizing of them through force and deceit."
