WARNS OF STICKERS

Sullivan 5/23/38
Sullivan to Act on Any Anti-Jewish Movement.

District Attorney Charles P. Sullivan of Queens announced at his office in Long Island City today that he will prosecute for libel any person who is caught pasting anti-Jewish stickers on store windows and on the walls of subway stations. He made the announcement at the conclusion of a conference relating to stickers which have been pasted up in various parts of Queens, especially Astoria, Jackson Heights and Jamaica.

Printing on the stickers read, "Save America. Don't buy from Jews."

Present at the conference was a delegation of fifteen persons who complained against the stickers. Officials who participated were, District Attorney Sullivan, Deputy Police Commissioner Charles P. Mooney, in charge of North Queens, and Police Capt. John Spain, in charge of special city subway police. Included in the complaining delegation were representatives of the American League for Peace and Decency, the Jewish War Veterans, the Jamaica Jewish Center, and the Jackson Heights Merchants Association.

They declared that the stickers have been pasted up surreptitiously, mostly at night, during the past two weeks on store windows and subway station walls. After nearly an hour of discussion, Mr. Sullivan assigned Assistant District Attorney David L. Dugan, to conduct an inquiry.
