

Sullivan Acts to Bar Cassidy From Practice

A resolution asking that John F. Cassidy, leader and chief rabble-rouser of the anti-Semitic Christian Front, be denied admission to the bar was introduced in the State Assembly last night by Patrick H. Sullivan, of the 11th AD (upper Manhattan).

Sullivan's resolution proposed that the Assembly recommend that the Appellate Division in Brooklyn deny Cassidy's application.

The resolution listed several anti-Semitic speeches Cassidy made in Brooklyn and Philadelphia. It cited an instance on Apr. 4, 1939, when Cassidy stated that President Roosevelt should not be impeached, that "the only possible way of getting rid of him is for somebody to murder him."
