ASSAILS COMMUNISTS FOR STRIKE ACTIVITY

Order of Eagles Calls on Mem-
bers to Condemn All Red ?
Doctrines. 36

CINCINNATI, Aug. 13 (AP).—Denouncing communist but pledging new efforts to improve the lot of the workers through social legislation, the Fraternal Order of Eagles closed its annual convention today.

The resolution condemning communistic efforts in the United States, introduced by Joseph Thomas of Akron, arose from an assertion by Frank Hering of South Bend, Ind., managing editor of the organization's magazine, that recent strike disorders have been inspired by Communist elements. Most strikes have had their inception in sincere demands by workers, Hering had said, adding that Communists had taken advantage of each situation to foment disorder.

The resolution called upon the Eagles to "express publicly their condemnation of all communism as we know it today, and likewise all kindred theories or doctrines which advocate the overthrow of our American government or the elevation of classes or groups above or beyond the limitation of government."
