He also accepted a subpena ordering him to appear Aug. 14 to testify and the same time exacted from Mr. atts a statement intended to clear him of any connection with the subject un-der investigation.

ACTORS LOYAL "In the interest of fairness," the Dis-trict Attorney said, "I desire to state that this office has no evidence of in-, formation which would justify this of-fice in seeking an indictment of Li-onel Stander for any crime or upon any criminal charge. "I wish to add that the evidence in our possession at this time indicates that, with a very few possible excep-tions, the acting profession is composed of patriotic American citizens against whom no implication of subversive ac-tivities can be made."

ANTI-NAZI

ANTI-NAZI Mr. Stander, who called on Mr. Fitts with his attorney, declared he never had been a Communist and never had contributed to the party. "I am a firm believer in the Con-stitution and American democracy, as are all members of the Screen Actors Guild," he said. "The only thing I can be charged with is that I was anti-Nazi before being anti-Nazi was fashionable and before people were aware of the Hitlerism menace." A \$65,000 damage suit against Mr. Fitts has been brought by Brittain Webster, accused of mutder in con-nection with the five-year-old slaying of a longshoreman. Mr. Webster charged he was held in secret custody four days without being allowed to communicate with hs family or attor-ney. Mr. Fitts had said Commun' plotted the murder.
