Coughlin Urges Dictatorship as

Lesser Menace'
DETROIT, Jan. 7 (U.P.).—The
Rev. Charles E. Coughlin asked in
his radio talk today if, under certain circumstances, "it is possibly
true that the retention of democracy would have proved a greater'
menace than the adoption of a
dictatorship."

The Priest quoted portions of
President Roosevelt's recent address before Congress, and a conclusion "that the continued mismanagement of domestic affairs
in the United States will produce
results in our homeland similar to
those which have appeared
abroad."

Coughlin said Mr. Roosevelt had
pointed out that dictatorships originated principally from "the necessity for drastic action to improve internal conditions where
democratic action, for one reason
or another, has failed to respond
to modern needs and modern demands."
