BROADCAST RESUMED BY FATHER COUGHLIN

**Choose Christ or Marx, He Tells
His Radio Hearers** 10

DETROIT, Feb. 11 (UP)—The Rev. Charles E. Coughlin returned to the air today but made no mention of the cancellation of his broadcast last week.

His address today was devoted largely to an explanation of and quotations from the report of the administrative board of the National Catholic Welfare Conference issued in Washington last week.

The report, dealing with ownership, property and labor, security, wages and the establishment of social order, advocated restoration of a Christian social order in which "ruthless competition must give

way to just and reasonable State regulation."

Franklin Mitchell, radio announcer for Father Coughlin, said today in an announcement preceding the priest's sermon that "a multitude of rumors" had circulated during the week, and added:

"When Father Coughlin is on the air, evidently that is not news. The moment he refrains from broadcasting, it becomes national first-page comment from Florida to Alaska—yes, even in the British press."

He advised that persons interested in comment on a recent request by the Jewish People's Committee for an investigation of Father Coughlin by the Department of Justice should send to the Shrine of the Little Flower in suburban Royal Oak for a new book titled "An Answer to Father Coughlin's Critics."

Father Coughlin, mentioning no controversial issues in his address, said that only two courses of life now were possible, "the ship of Christ and the ship of Marx."

"Ours is the choice to accept the

principles taught from the pulpit of the Cross or the errors preached on the flagstones of the Red Square.
"Choose ye whom you shall follow—the Prince of Peace or the God of war; the spirit of love or the demon of hate; Christ or chaos."
