McWilliams workers, adorned with Will-kie buttons, had canvassed the Yorkville section and obtained the petitions necessary to put their local fuehrer on the primary ballot.

The regular Republican machine, how-ever, has vowed to smother McWilliams' hopes when the primary contest is run off

next month.

As the deadline for filing primary petitions ended last midnight, John J. O'Connor, purged by Roosevelt in 1938, entered both the Republican and Democratic fights in the 19th Congresional District. In the 20th Dis-16th Congresional District. In the 20th District, the local Republican machine somewhat unwillingly will have to give the party designation to the incumbent, Vito Marcantonio.

McWilliams is scheduled for arraignment in Harlem Court today on a disorderly conduct charge.-w. T.
