New York, Oct. 1 (AP). — Joseph E. McWilliams, who was defeated two weeks ago in a bid for a Republican Congressional nomination, today was sentenced to 75 days in the workhouse on a disorderly conduct conviction based on an anti-Semitic street speech. Seven days he spent in the psychiatric ward at Bellevue Hospital were deducted from the sentence. It was his second conviction following anti-Jewish oratory. The first brought him a \$50 fine on July 6.
