ABILL

To outlaw the Communist Party, the German-American Bund, and all organizations, groups, or individuals associated therewith who seek to overthrow the Government of the United States by force or violence through the advocacy of criminal anarchy, criminal communism, criminal nazi-ism, and criminal fascism.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That criminal anarchy, criminal communism, criminal nazi-
- 4 ism, or criminal fascism are doctrines that existing forms of
- 5 constitutional government should be overthrown by force or
- 6 violence or by any other unlawful means, or by assassination
- 7 of officials of the Government of the United States or of the

- 1 several States. The advocacy of such doctrines either by
- 2 word of mouth or writing or the promotion of such doctrines
- 3 independently or in collaboration with or under the guidance
- 4 of officials of a foreign state or an international revolutionary
- 5 party or group is a felony.
- 6 SEC. 2. Any person who—
- 7 (a) By word of mouth or writing advocates, advises, or
- 8 teaches the duty, necessity, or propriety of overthrowing or
- 9 overturning existing forms of constitutional government by
- 10 force or violence; of disobeying or sabotaging or hindering the
- 11 carrying out of the laws, orders, or decrees of duly constituted
- 12 civil, naval, or military authorities; or by the assassination
- 13 of officials of the Government of the United States or of the
- 14 several States or by any unlawful means or under the guid-
- 15 ance of or in collaboration with officials, agents, or representa-
- 16 tives of a foreign state or an international revolutionary
- 17 party or group; or
- (b) Prints, publishes, edits, issues, or knowingly circu-
- 19 lates, sells, distributes, or publicly displays any book, paper,
- 20 document, or written or printed matter in any form, con-
- 21 taining or advocating, advising or teaching the doctrine that
- 22 constitutional government should be overthrown by force,
- 23 violence, or any unlawful means; or
- (c) Openly, willfully, and deliberately urges, advocates,
- 25 or justifies by word of mouth or writing the assassination or

- 1 unlawful killing or assaulting of any official of the Govern-
- 2 ment of the United States or of the several States because of
- 3 his official character or any other crime, with intent to teach,
- 4 spread, or advocate the propriety of the doctrines of criminal
- 5 anarchy, criminal communism, criminal nazi-ism, or criminal
- 6 fascism; or
- 7 (d) Organizes or helps to organize or becomes a mem-
- 8 ber of or voluntarily assembles with any society, group, or
- 9 assembly of persons formed to teach or advocate such doc-
- 10 trines; or
- (e) Becomes a member of, associated with, or promotes
- 12 the interest of any criminal anarchistic, communistic, nazi-
- 13 istic, or fascistic organization, or helps to organize or becomes
 - a member of or affiliated with any subsidiary organization or
- 15 associated group of persons who advocates, teaches, or ad-
- 16 vises the principles of criminal anarchy, criminal communism,
- 17 criminal nazi-ism, or criminal fascism;
- Shall be guilty of a felony and upon conviction thereof
- 19 be subject to imprisonment for not more than ten years or
- 20 a fine of not more than \$10,000, or both.
- SEC. 3. Whenever two or more persons assemble for the
- 22 purpose of promoting, advocating, or teaching the doctrines
- 23 of criminal anarchy, criminal communism, criminal nazi-ism,
- 24 or criminal fascism, as defined in section 1 of this Act, such
- 25 an assembly or organization is unlawful, and every person

- 1 voluntarily participating therein by his presence, aid, or insti-
- 2 gation shall be guilty of a felony and upon conviction thereof
- 3 shall be subject to imprisonment for not more than ten years
- 4 or a fine of not more than \$10,000, or both.
- SEC. 4. No owner, agent, superintendent, janitor, care-
- 6 taker, or occupant of any place, building, or room, shall
- 7 willfully and knowingly permit therein any assemblage of
- 8 persons prohibited by section 3 of this Act, and if such
- 9 person after notification that the premises are so used permits
- 10 such use to be continued, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor
- 11 and upon conviction thereof subject to imprisonment for not
- 12 more than one year or fine of not more than \$1,000, or
- 13 both.
- SEC. 5. Every editor or publisher of a book, newspaper,
- 15 or serial and every manager of a partnership or incorporated
- 16 association by which a book, newspaper, or serial is issued,
- 17 is chargeable with the publication of any matter contained
- 18 in such book, newspaper, or serial. But in every prosecu-
- 19 tion therefor, the defendant may show in his defense that the
- 20 matter complained of was published without his knowledge
- 21 or fault and against his wishes, by another who had no
- 22 authority from him to make the publication and whose act
- 23 was disavowed by him so soon as known.
