## **Drops** Jew-Baiting: Sen. Reynolds Publishing His Propaganda Sheet

Sen. Robert Reynolds (D., N. C.) has resumed publication of the American Vindicator, a propaganda sheet used before the war to trumpet the Senator's head-in-the-sand stand.

Once the cause of nationwide criti-cism, particularly on the score of anti-Semitism, the Vindicator has appar-ently taken an abrupt about face in its new September edition under the pressure of war.

HITS AT LABOR UNIONS

Published by a local concern, the Washington Printing Ca., 1987 Wiscon-sin-av nw, it now advocates: "Win the War . . Outlaw Communism . . . Abolish All Isms Except Americanism . . . Stop All Immigration Now and Register All Labor Unions."

Accompanying the revised propa-ganda note of the chairman of the Milipropatary Affairs Committee is carefully-selected news matter showing how much Mr. Reynolds is doing to win the war and cartoons fervently alibying for pre-war isolationism. "News matter" of The Vindicator in-

cludes attacks on union chiefs as sabo-teurs and four or five columns dedi-cated to the Senator's activities, includ-ing his introduction of a measure to register labor unions. Puppet publisher of the journal is the

same group which was the center of criticism stemming from his own state prior to the war on grounds of "sub-

prior to the war on grounds of "sub-versive activity." Apparently the Post Office didn't think enough of the newspaper qual-ities of the sheet to approve its appeal for a second-class mail permit. Officials there would not disclose the reason. It is still being malled under third-class, or circular rate, for 20 cents a copy.
