Coughlin Still Incites Sedition

Biddle Fails to Act Against 'Social Justice,' Despite PM

Social Justice still publishes And U. S. Attorney General Biddle still has taken no action on PM's evidence that Social Justice is spreading its seditious line into defense factories and Army camps,

The Social Justice published Sunday made these inflammatory statements:

¶ Our country is standing on the "brink of chaos.

¶ The war is being waged between the "boycotters" and the "boycotted" (the Nazis).

¶ The Jews are greatly to blame for our national disunity.

 \P The Government's charges against the Standard Oil Co. of New Jersey have "backfired."

In addition, the magazine: ¶ Printed a letter asking why the war was being fought.

Printed a letter denouncing the "aristo-crats of the world" (a Social Justice term for Jews) and their "bloody outlook" and "insolent assaults."

Shrieks at PM

Social Justice also took a full page to scream about the charge made by PM that it is spreading sedition; that the readers of Social Justice-defense workers and near relatives of men in the armed forces-absorb its line and utter sedition.

Most of the answer could have been anticipated. Social Justice called PM "radical, slanderous, untrustworthy" and said it was "inciting its readers to contemplate the mur-der of Father Coughlin."

Social Justice urged its readers to write the Attorney General and request an inves-tigation of PM. But it cautioned them to be "respectful in your language-not vituperative.'
