On Monday PM proved that Social Justice was endangering America's war effort. Since that day PM received and tabulated

277 written replies, of which only 37 were opposed to PM's stand.

More than half of those who opposed More than hair or those who opposed PM's stand failed to sign their names. Many of these wrote about "pogroms," "revolu-tion" and killing those who didn't think Coughlin was a saint or a man on a white horse. Others who hid their bravery behind

anonymity wanted "the Jews killed." This type of letter merely proved PM's point that Social Justice incited people to sedition, violence and intolerance.

More than half the replies were from Catholics who said they were Catholics. The overwhelming majority of these praised PM for stressing the point that Coughlin was not just a Catholic issue but an issue of national security.

One reader felt so strongly that he re-corded his protest against Social Justice on a phonograph record and dispatched it to Attorney General Biddle.

Here is a cross-section of letters PM received:

Congratulations on your campaign expos-ing the machinations of Coughlin. I believe that Coughlin is a menace to our

liberties and our war effort. He must be stopped immediately if we are to win this war and help build a world where man can live in peace.
