Retrial Studied In 'Front' Case Rogge to Confer

With Jackson

NEW YORK, June 25 (C.T.P.S.). Conferences this week in Washing ton and Brooklyn will decide whether there will be retrials for seditious conspiracy for the five Christian Fronters over whose guilt a Federal jury in Brooklyn disagreed yesterday, it was learned today.

John O. Rogge, chief of the criminal division of the Attorney General's office, said in Washington that he plans to discuss the outcome of the Brooklyn trial with Attorney General Robert Jackson. Rogge will then come to Brooklyn, to confer with United States Attorney Harold M. Kennedy on the matter.

On July 3, Judge Marcus B. Campbell is scheduled to hear motions arising from the trial, which ended in acquittal for nine of the 14 defendants and mistrials, because of disagreement, for the others. ton that he plans to discuss the

It was freely predicted today that the five men whom the jury failed to acquit will not be retired.
