The United States government "good, sound American principles" yesterday ran true to form in its kid-glove treatment of Christian Front terrorists-it moved to postpone until September 4 court mo-tions either to re-try or free five members of the anti-Semitic band upon whom a jury disagreed a week ago after a ten-week trial on charges of plotting to overthrow the United States government by violence.
