## U. S. Postpones Court Action Against 'Front'

The United States government yesterday ran true to form in its kid-glove treatment of Christian Front terrorists—it moved to postpone until September 4 court motions either to re-try or free five members of the anti-Semitic band upon whom a jury disagreed a week ago after a ten-week trial on charges of plotting to overthrow the United States government by violence.

Nine of the band were acquitted by a jury on June 24 after United States Attorney Harold M. Kennedy concluded a meek and apologetic "prosecution" with praise for the

"good, sound American principles" of the anti-Semitic, brawl-provoking Christian Front.

Assistant United States Attorney T. Vincent Quinn yesterday asked the continuance of the case without explaining the reason for the government's delay. His request was granted by Federal Judge Robert Inch.

The judge also reduced the bail of William Gerald Bishop, leader of the Front's so-called "Action Committee," from \$10,000 to \$5,000. Bishop has been held in jail since his arrest on January 14, the only one of the fourteen original defendants unable to raise his bail.
