## Henry Allen Trial Put Off Another Month<sup>A</sup><sub>©c</sub>

Henry Allen, anti-Semite, who has spent almost as much of his life in jail as out, this week had another month of liberty to spend distributing Nazi leaflets and running around the country as go-between for Hitler agents.

His trial for registering illegally after he had been disfranchised as a criminal was postponed until November 3 when it came up Monday in Judge Charles W. Fricke's court.

That Allen is trying to escape trial was obvious in his attempts to have the case continued. It has been pending in the courts since June.

Judge Fricke denied the motion to continue, but later had to set the trial ahead because the court calendar was full.

Allen had just barely skinned out of a sentence in San Diego for carrying concealed weapons when he was arrested in Los Angeles on the vote fraud charge.

His chief pastime is going to the roofs of high buildings and tossing down leaflets. The leaflets are printed at the Peerless Printing Co., 526 South Fair Oaks, in Pasadena, where Allen lives.

A man named Hayes is the owner of the print shop. Allen's son was once his apprentice.
