DST...Room, board and tuition for vo weeks at The Summit is only LOO.OO. The only extra expense is or personal expenditures the stuent elects to make. Insurance is vailable for \$1.00 and a class lcture may be purchased for \$1.00. ome spending money is advisable.

CHOLARSHIPS...There are scholarnips available for those students no are financially unable to pay or their own tuition. Application or scholarships should be made mmediately to YOUTH UNIVERSITY EPARTMENT, Box 977, Tulsa, Oklaoma 74102.

OTHING...School clothes (inuding skirts, blouses, dresses id sweaters for girls) are to be rn during classroom lectures and als. Slacks and Bermuda shorts in only be worn during picnics, orts and hiking. One outfit itable for "dressing up" will be fficient. Sweaters and warm othes for evenings are advisable. blankets, sheets, pillow or bedlls are necessary.

ASS SESSIONS...Mornings, afternoons d evenings are used for classroom rk. Notebooks, pencils and pens e necessary. Some organized sports ents will be held on Tuesday, Thursy and Saturday to break the long urs of study, and relax the students. rship services are held.

LOVE AND PEACE, SUMMIT STYLE

My dictionary defines "summit" as "the topmost level yet attained or attainable." Certainly nothing could better describe "... influence, atmosphere, and curriculum of the Christian Crusade Youth University at the Summit Hotel in Manitou Springs, Colorado.

When our daughters, Denise and Diane, were awarded scholarships at the University we soon discovered that the Summit, nestled in the heart of Pikes Peak Playground, could solve our family vacation dilemma. Obviously one vehicle would be inadequate for the six of us and all our gear so the four young Evers piled into the Volksbus with the folks in the small car and our family caravan headed east. A walkie-talkie system, contrived by Dennis, our 13 year old inventive genius, kept us in touch—we quickly discovered that being able to electronically tune out the children is the ultimate in travel pleasure!

When we reached the Summit, it was love at first sight. Majestically this stately old edifice topped with a white cross, looms over Manitou Springs. Twas a home away from home, for checkered tablecloths and wicker reckers are my cup of tea—the "mod" and garish leaves me cold. If accommodations pleased us, to be sure the fellowship with all those wonderful Summiteers was to be among our most cherished experiences.

NON-SECTARIAN COURSES

Founded in the summer of 1962 by Dr. Billy James Hargis, the Summit Youth University since that time has averaged about 35 students a session for six 2 week courses each summer. In this setting of unexcelled beauty for a course in Christian Americanism the total cost per student is just \$100.00! Scholarshipe are offered for worthy candidates. Non-sectarian in nature, students representing Catholic and Protestant faiths alike come from every corner of the nation including Alaska.

The Dean, Rev. David Noebel, and a qualified staff provide intensive instruction in such subjects as the Bible, American History, The United Nations, and Communist Influence in Religion. The daytime studies are enriched with nightly films, after which the students congregate at the Snack-Bar to conclude each tightly scheduled day that started with a 7:00 a.m. bell.

An enchanting balcony provides guests the opportunity to sit in on classes. Your writer confesses to having learned more during these sessions than at any other conservative conclave. First of all, the Summit is extremely well organized; furthermore, the behavior of all those wonderful kids was exemplary (these traits do not characterize most conservative functions.) David Noebel is just the right combination of intellect and nice fellow—he commands respect and maintains control noiselessly. We shall best remember him, however, for his ability to realistically relate contemporary politics and events to the Scriptures.

How do the students feel about the Summit University? Judging from two weeks of close observation my conclusion is that they love it. We asked the class president, Reuben Reveles of Amarillo, Texas in what manner he felt that his attending Summit University would affect his future. His reply: "This course has convinced me that my ambition to play professional baseball must be sacrificed so I can return to Mexico when my education is complete and work with an effective group to combat atheistic Communism."

Today in the United States, to satisfy the needs of their vastly expanded program the Communists are operating a complete educational system to educate young people in Marxist-Leninist concepts.
