Anti-Semite Kicked Off CMTC Rolls On Protest

**Zoll, Who Headed
WMCA Pickets, Still
Held on Extortion**

Allen A. Zoll, anti-Semitic follower of Father Coughlin and at present under indictment for attempted extortion, did his best to be among the blue bloods now starting Army training at the Peekskill Citizens Military Training Camp, but a flood of protests from aroused citizens succeeded in cleansing him from the rolls.

The letters and phone calls strated pouring into the office of the Citizens Military Training Camp when a list of the names of those accepted for training was printed. Zoll's name was the last on the list.

Zoll, identified with numerous anti-Semitic organizations, won his greatest notoriety as leader of the band of pickets who beleaguered radio station WMCA when it cancelled its broadcasts of Father Coughlin's speeches last Spring.

On July 7, 1939, Zoll was arrested and indicted on charges of demanding \$7,500 from the radio station as his price for calling off the pickets. He is still under bail.

Zoll's application to the CMTC was accompanied by a declaration that his sponsor was General Robert Lee Bullard, but the General says he knows Zoll only as an ex-soldier whom he thought was "all right."
