After six months of hiding Silver-Shister Pelley emerged on February 6, 1940, to give Dies " a clean bill of health." Snuggling to the committee's the members bosom Pelley praised them as "fine, Christian gentlemen", showed similarity of objectives, and promised to disband his vigilantes"if the Dies committee goes ahead". Thanks to the committee's activity, he said, "My work is done." All the exhibits used during this love-fest had been printed and distributed by Pelley: Still carefully locked in committee files is a 40-page typewritten list of Pelley's correspondents, prepared by the Post Office Department. While the publication loudly proclaiming release of this list--even assailing President Roosevelt relate on this basis -- Dies steadfastly refuses to print it. The committee sent Pelley four warnings in advance of its intention of subpenaeing him, giving him ample time to disappear. Days after his KENENEXEX "expected" appearance, a subpena atill had not been issued.
