Proof that Chairman Dies of the Committee on un-American Activities knew McCuiston was wanted by the New Orleans police for the murder of Phil Carey is the following telegram sent to him by President Joseph Curran:

October 30, 1939.

"Hon. Martin Dies
House Office Building
Washington, D. C.

"Our understanding William C. McCuiston witness now testifying before you against National Maritime Union is wanted by Federal Agents for questioning in regard to recent murders of members National Maritime Union in Gulf area. Will you please extend your cooperation by checking above with Attorney General Murphy. Please confirm wire.
