

Detroit's Ex-Police Head Indicted in Tax Case

DETROIT, July 26.—Fred W. Frahm, former Detroit police superintendent awaiting trial on charges of having accepted protection money from gamblers during his tenure of office, was named in a four-count Federal grand jury indictment today charging income tax evasion.

John C. Lehr, U. S. district attorney, said the indictment alleged Frahm paid only \$415.76 in income taxes from 1936 to 1940, while the Government charged he should have paid \$8,901.63.
