Detroit's Ex-Police Head Indicted in Tax Case By the Associated Press. Jon 7/26/40 DETROIT, July 26.—Fred W. Frahm, former Detroit police super-intendent awaiting trial on charges of having accepted protection money from gamblers during his tenure of office, was named in a four-count Federal grand jury indictment to-day charging income tax evasion. John C. Lehr, U. S. district at-torney, said the indictment alleged Frahm paid only \$415.76 in income taxes from 1936 to 1940, while the Government charged he should have paid \$8,901.63.
