HOLLYWOOD, Aug. 18 (UP).—
The Hollywood Anti-Nari League today attacked a congressional committee for accusing the League of communistic sympathies without revealing substantiating facts.
"It is ominous that the Dies Investigating Committee has adopted the practice of making accusations without revealing facts to substantiate them," the League's statement tate them," the League's statement and. "... These charges leveled against an organization devoted to the task of combatting Naxism are in themselves a threat to democracy."

"The Hollywood Anti-Nazi League repudiates this attack. We stand on our record and call for a real investigation of Nazi notivities in this country, which—after exposing Nazi activity—will point out the need for action against it instead of attacking the organization formed for the purpose of taking such action."
