Voorhis Assails Effort to Purge Foes of Reds To the County Member,

However, Denies U.D.A. Is Subversive

Representative Jerry Voorhis (D.), of California, a member of the Dies Committee on Un-American Activities, yesterday issued a one-man minority report denouncing an undertaking by the so-called Union for Democratic Action to "purge" anti-Communist members of Congress, but denying that the U.D.A. is either Communist dominated or subversive.

A majority report issued by the committee Tuesday named the U.D.A. as the spearhead of a totalitarian conspiracy to undermine public confidence in Congress as an institution, and thereby to destroy representative government.

The majority reported revealed the past connections of 27 U.D.A. leaders with an organization called the American League Against War and Fascism, which was denounced

as "a bold advocate of treason."

Voorhis also condemns the 32lage report issued by the U.D.A. n collaboration with the left ing magazine New Republic, hich purports to analyze the oting records of members of Conress and calls for the defeat of those whom it charges with "obstructionism."

He points out that the U.D.A. "fails to say a word in criticism of the one member who even voted against national defense appropriation bills after the war in Europe began." This refers to Representative Vito Marcantonio (A.L.), of New York, who has been characterized by James A. Farley as the only Communist member of Congress. Voorhis agrees that Marcantonio's "was the most dangerous single type of 'obstruction' of all."
