Examination of the statements filed by these committees with the clerk of the House of Representatives persuant to the Carrupt Practises Act of 1925 shows regular monthly payments in the name of the magazine and not in the name of the printing company. While in most cases the amounts of these payments is intthe neighborhood of \$100 or less, they go much higher doing political campaigns.

There is an interesting notation on the statement covering the third quarter of 1933. On 7/31/35 the Republican National Committee sent the National Republic a check for \$11.00 labeled "Contribution receipts."
