

Valtin Cites Book as Proof He Shouldn't Be Deported

NEW YORK, June 5 (N. Y. News)—Confident that he would not be deported to Germany to face certain execution, Jan Valtin, author of "Out of the Night," today testified before a board of two immigration inspectors concerning his recent aid to defense activities here.

The record of the hearing at Ellis Island, together with briefs of Valtin's lawyer, Hugo Pollock, will be sent to the Department of Justice in Washington for decision.

The brief will cite Valtin's "good character for the last five years," Pollock said, and also the fact that Mrs. Valtin, a United States citizen, is expecting a child in August.
