Explosion of three tons of nitroglyderin at the Repaupo plant of the Du Pont Co., killing two men and injuring five, was put down today as an accident.

Thee no reason to suspect sabotage, declared Col. Mark O. Kimberling of the State police.

Than possibility drew attention of both State police and the Federal Buread of Investigation immediately after sesterday's midmorning blast. The Dif Pont Co. manufactures war materials at some plants.

The explosion shattered windows and jarred buildings for miles around. Thousands in Philadelphia, 13 miles north, rushed from homes and buildings fearing an earthquake.
