## Biddle Sees Further Ban

Atty. Gen. Francis Biddle today expressed opinion that the U.S. Government has sufficient war-time powers to halt all circulation of the mails-banned Social Justice magazine even

Mr. Biddle said a complete investigation of the publication's backing, circulation, policy and possible Axis tieups would be undertaken next week by the Federal grand jury investigating Axis propaganda.

The Rev. Charles E. Coughlin, founder, who now claims no official connection with the magazine other than that his father and mother are understood to hold controlling stock interest, may be among the witnesses called.

In Detroit he expressed willingness to answer to Biddle's charge that Social Justice editorials have been a "series of systematic seditious utterances," closely paralleling Axis propaganda
