Isolationist Leaders Get

Sedition Probe Subpenss

CHICAGO, April 24—Deputy marshals today served subpenas on three leaders of pre-war isolationist groups, requiring them to appear before a Federal grand jury investigating seditious activities.

The subpenas, the first ordered in an anti-sedition drive announced by the Justice Department, were served on Mrs. Janet Ayer Fairbank, national vice chairman of the defunct America First Committee; William J. Grace, chairman of the "Citizens United States Committee," and Mrs. Lyrl Van Hyning, chairman of "We the Mothers Mobilize for America Inc."

Grace's organization formerly was called the Citizens Committee to Keep America Out of War.
