### Grand Jury to Call

#### Father Coughlin Later

Three more employees of the magazine Social Justice, founded by Rev. Charles E. Coughlin, Detroit's famed "radio priest," were summoned yesterday to appear with 10 already called to appear before the special District Grand Jury probing Axis propaganda.

The new witnesses are Catherine Clinton, file clerk of Social Justice; Alberta Ward, acting secretary-treasurer of the magazine, and Catherine Smith, an editorial aide. They were all subpoenaed to appear Friday.

Cora Quinlan, former secretary-treasurer of Social Justice; Mary Mae Schulte, circulation manager, and Marie Rhodes, an employe at the Shrine of the Little Flower Church, Royal Oaks, Mich., of which Father Coughlin is pastor, led the parade of witnesses before the Grand Jury yesterday.

After the 13 witnesses have been heard, Special Prosecutor William Power Maloney said Father Coughlin would be summoned to testify. The rest of the week is expected to be consumed in laying the groundwork of this testimony, he indicated.

Two former witnesses, David Baxter, San Bernardino (Calif.) editor, and William Robert Lyman, of Detroit, connected with the "American Unity League" and "League of American Workers," were recalled by the Grand Jury and made brief appearances.
