'End War Quickly!' Veils Propaganda

Publication Called 'America in Danger' Adopted Slogan to Cloak Its Attacks

(Editor's note—Scores of verminous little sheets, each with a few thousand readers, are gnawing away at the faith and unity of our people, whispering defeat and clamoring about "freedom of the press." Their common policy—"made in Germany"—is to turn Americans against one another, and to split America from the United Nations. This is the third article of a series about these papers.)

For about eight years, Charles B. Hudson has slandered the Jews and attacked the Government of the United States, in a mimeographed publication which he calls "America in Danger!"

When Hitler invaded Poland, Hudson swung into the most rabid ranks of isolation.

He was supplied Congressional Record reprints in quantity and mailed them from Omaha, Nebr., under Congressional frank.

When America was attacked, Hudson adopted the slogan "End the War Quickly!" and went on as before.

He's Playing It Safe

Until the courts act, the question whether Hudson's publication is seditious is one for the opinion of those who read it. His own opinion is indicated by his December 22 issue, which said:

NOTICE: If any soldier received AID: bulletin, I did not send it. If any subscriber joins Armed Forces, advise me so I can remove name from AID: mailing list.

The Army sees to strict enforcement of the law against sending subversive material to its soldiers.

Hudson declares he is neither a Nazi nor anti-Semitic, but is "humbly seeking to follow in Christ's footsteps." Indeed, he says, it is

partly for the Jews' own sake that he "must reiterate warnings that Christians must have no brotherhood with unbelievers, particularly the Synagogue of Satan (Organized Jewry-Intl. Finance)."

This phrase, "Synagogue of Satan," is almost a Hudson trademark, although "Publicity," "The X-Ray" and others of the vermin press use it occasionally.

A few weeks ago, Hudson charged the Jews with deliberately spreading typhus in Europe and asked whether Jewish cooperation in establishing blood banks was not "prophetic of the predicted epidemics due in America."

Hudson expressed outrage over the ousting of Fascist-minded George Dethrage from a Navy construction job.

In the prosecution of William Dudley Pelley for sedition Hudson sees a "Synagogue of Satan" plot.

Opposition to the Dies Committee, says Hudson, stems from "the Jews."

Saw Viereck "Persecuted"

Persecuted, says Hudson, was George Sylvester Viereck, the jailed Nazi agent. Hudson invites his readers to send 10 cents for "inside stuff" about this trial.

The recently begun investigation of the Omaha agitator is expected to be extensive.

It may lead to those behind him.

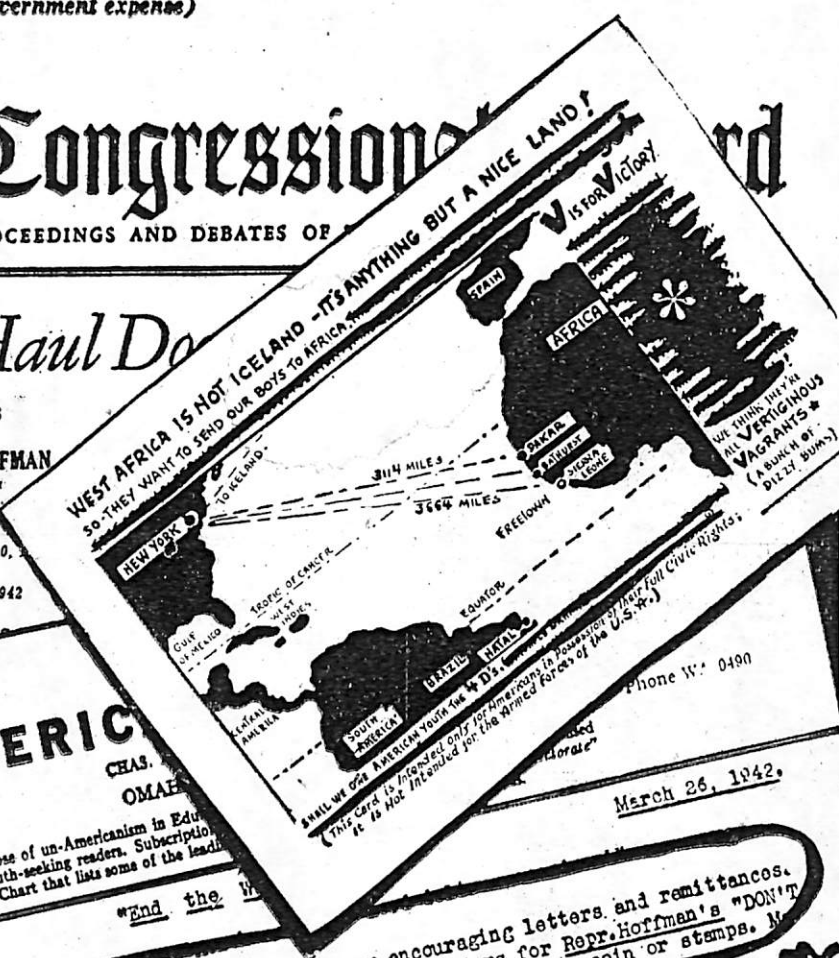
