Bund Leader Out on Bail On 'Race Hatred' Count

By the Associated Press. The Wilson NEWTON, N. J., Nov. 15.—Wilhelm Kunze, national leader of the German-American Bund, was released in \$1,000 bail today after he pleaded innocent before Sussex County Judge John C. Losey to an

County Judge John C. Losey to an indictment charging him with "promoting race hatred" against Jews.

Kunze was indicted with nine other bund members and associates who pleaded innocence when arraigned October 18. The national leader's arraignment was deferred because Kunze was in California. He was indicted for having permitted the speeches to be made at the Bund's Camp Nordland at Andover.

Trial date will be set after a hearing November 27 on the constitutionality of a statute prohibiting speeches tending to create racial or religious discrimination. The act was challenged by John Winans, counsel for nine of the men, in a brief filed Wednesday.
