**NAZI LEAFLETS IRK
GERMANS IN JERSEY**

**Springfield Society Enlists Fed-
eral and Police Aid in Trac-
ing Offending Plane.**

SPRINGFIELD, N. J., Aug. 8.—
An investigation into the identity of
a mystery airplane which dropped
Nazi leaflets on a German gather-
ing here Sunday and Monday was
started today by the police and a
representative of the Aeronautics
Branch of the Department of Com-
merce.

The investigation came at the re-
quest of Albert F. Frosch, president
of the United Singers Society, which
held the meetings, 7,000 strong. The
society is a German organization
made up of conservatives not in sym-
pathy with the "Friends of the New
Germany" reputed to be the Ameri-
can branch society of Nazi sym-
patizers.

According to Mr. Frosch, the air-
plane flew over his assembly and its
noise interrupted a community sing
which was in progress. The plane
dropped a quantity of Nazi leaf-
lets printed in German protesting
against his refusal of permission to
allow the Friends of the New Ger-
many to be represented.
