post's hospitilization committee, said he was "compiling a list of 1,000" names or more" of men who would be mustered "when needed to com-bat the non-American tactics and maneuvres of the Nazi Bund." Jeremiah F. Cross, State Com-mander of the Legion, said that of all the names mentioned in connec-tion with the riot, only two at any time were members of the Legion. Thomas F. Dugan, Kings County commander, said an investigation was under way. He said the action of the "alleged members" in putting on Legion capes when they were at-tacked "was in clear violation of the mandates and orders of the national

mandates and orders of the national organization."

tion of Fascist and Communist, activity in the United States was sounded today by Daniel L. Doherty, national commander of the American Legion.

Asserting "apathy and indifference are democracy's greatest dangers," Mr. Doherty said Americans made no effort to prevent the Ger-man-American Bund holding a New York meeting this/week in honor of the forty-ninth birthday of Adolf Hitler.
