

Westchester Threatens To Close Center to Bund

Commission Not Disposed to Let Group Use Hall Again

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., April 25.—Dana Caulkins, superintendent of the Westchester County Recreation Commission, wrote today to H. H. Greve, president of the German-American Societies of Westchester, that the commission would not be disposed to grant the use of the County Center again either to Mr. Greve's organization or to the allied German-American Bund.

In applying for the use of the center for the meeting held there last night, said Mr. Caulkins, the German-American Societies had said it was to be used for "an entertainment and dance." His own observation convinced him, he said, that at least seven speeches were made which contained propaganda. "This in my judgment," he continued, "will seriously prejudice the future attitude of the County Recreation Commission against granting concessions for the use of the building to the German-American Societies or the German-American Bund."

Philip Edwards and William McGrath, Bronxville High School students who were arrested last night, accused of distributing stench bombs at the meeting, had their hearing on charges of disorderly conduct postponed today until Thursday.
