Bund Opposes Violence, Says Leader, Back From Germany

Fritz Kuhn, national director of the German-American Bund, re-turned to New York yesterday aboard the Red Star liner Penn-land, after a trip abroad that in-cluded seven weeks in Germany and Austria.

Mr. Kuhn said that he had gone to visit his parents in Munich and to engage in chemidal research but had been in Vienna dour days be-fore the Germana took over the city, and had also driven through Austria. He deviated that the Austrians had welformed Nazism. He denisd that he had obtimed funds for his organization while abroad. The bund, whose membership in the United States ne States and 200,000, would welforme a Congres-sional investigation, he said, as-serting, in reply to questions, that the organization was opposed to violence. "Of course, if we me attacked we have to detend ourselves." he said. "We always try to get the police authorities, though." Three men, two of whom wore gray-shift uniforms under eigilian overdets, met him at the pier. The three were identified as officiers of the bund.
